### **Organization and Implementation of East Asia Study Programs**

#### **I. Program on East Asian Development**

Summers 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009 & 2012: Organized, recruited, directed and brought to successful conclusion a 9-week, multi-city East Asia study program. Negotiated arrangements with several Chinese and Korean universities. Program was built around two five-credit -hour courses studying the role of the state in the East Asian development process and the relation between economic development and political democratization in East Asia. Case studies of South Korea, Japan, Taiwan, China and

especially the Pearl River Delta-Hong Kong nexus were studied as group traveled overland or by sea from Seoul, Busan, Shimonoseki, Osaka, Tokyo, Kaoshiung, Taipei, Hong Kong, Guangdong, Beijing, and Shanghai. Key organizing concept of program was that East Asian development must be understood in a regional context. Kept within budget, made a modest profit, and brought all students home safely.

## **II. China's Transition from Planned to Market Economy**

Summers 1996, 1998, 2000: Conceptualized, organized, recruited and directed 8-week summer program based at Fudan University in Shanghai and focusing on **China's transition from a planned to a market economy**. Negotiated arrangements with Fudan University, including a bus service for visiting scholar support arrangement that brought 3 Fudan faculty to Tech subsequent to each iteration of the program. . Program included intense class-room study at Fudan, combined with frequent visits to work units in area, and several longer excursions to industrial centers in the interior (Shengyang, Changchun, Xian, Chengdu). Kept within budet, made a modest profit, and brought all students safely home. This was the 1<sup>st</sup> China program of any school in the University System of Georgia.

Summer 1984: **Directed Pomona College's China Program at Nanjing University**. Conducted students on excursion up Yangtze River to Chongqing, then southward by railway to Kunming and Guangzhou.
